The Ruth Project in the Diocese of Antisiranana in northern Madagascar, is led by Alice Chung, wife of bishop Roger. Its purpose is the spiritual and

economic transformation of the women involved. Ruth was set up with funding from the Mothers Union here in the UK.

Regularly 15 members depend on the proceeds from the embroidery. The majority are in their 40s, but they include two grandmother in their 60s. Otherwise they are dependent on occasional income from selling cakes or vegetables. They meet for prayer and Bible study every Saturday afternoon.

There is one project which aims to connect running water to the Ruth members' houses. One Ruth member is also an Evangelist from the cathedral involved in adult literacy work, recently teaching a 48 year old grandmother to read.

These are beautifully made products through which we can support this ministry among the poor.

### Church welcomes government commitment on 'Rain Tax'

The announcement made by the Government on Monday to use law to scrap the 'Rain Tax', has been welcomed by churches and voluntary groups across England and Wales. The news follows a petition against the proposed tax, which was delivered to Downing Street earlier this year. Many clergy and church officers in Canterbury Diocese were among the 40,000 signatories on the petition.

Speaking at the Labour Party Conference on 28 September, Environment Secretary Hilary Benn announced that the Government will legislate to allow water companies to introduce a social tariff in their areas – thereby bypassing Ofwat. He said:

"Some churches, sports clubs and youth groups have been hit by huge increases in their water bills for surface drainage. It isn't right. So I can tell you today that we will legislate to allow water companies to run concessionary schemes for these organisations so they can get on with the great job they are doing instead of worrying about unaffordable bills."

At present this network is mainly London based, except in the area of psychiatry and psychology where we do have a more local network. The Honorary Consultants operate very much as they always have and offer free consultations to all clergy patients, if treatment is required following the consultation this is either carried out at the Consultants' NHS hospital, if appropriate, or it is referred back to the local NHS practice.

- Bereavement expenses and some of the expenses arising from separation and divorce.
