Easter Eve (Holy Saturday)

22.00 hrs

The Easter Vigil: the lighting of the Easter Candle, Vigil readings and chants, renewal of Baptism, Confirmation and first Eucharist of Easter.

Accommodation and meals for Holy Week in the Cathedral Lodge, immediately next to the Cathedral

A special rate for first class accommodation on B&B or half-board basis will be offered by the Cathedral Lodge to anyone wishing to participate in the above programme. Guests are able to book rooms for selected days or for the entire week.

Most meals will be eaten together in the refectory of the Lodge. A buffet supper will be provided in the Lodge before the Archbishop's lectures, and a light sandwich lunch will be provided as part of the lunchtime talks.

The Archbishop's Lectures



The Most Revd Dr Rowan Williams will deliver a series of three lectures on 'St Paul: the Man and his Letters' in the Cathedral at **19.30 hrs** each evening on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

"Outsiders and Insiders: Paul's Social World."

Tuesday 3rd April:

"The Universal Welcome: Paul's Disturbing Idea."

Wednesday 4th April:

"The New creation: Paul's Christian Universe."

A short sequence of Passion music and readings, led by the Cathedral choir will follow each lecture.

The Good Friday Liturgy with the Proclamation of the Cross, the singing of the Passion and Communion

12.00 noon – 15.00 hrs

The Three Hours Devotion – with readings, music and hymns. Preacher: The Revd Canon Paul Bradshaw, Professor of Liturgy, University of Notre Dame, USA.
