Net Zero Carbon

Some concerns

Our plan to reach net zero carbon by 2030.

Highlights

- Net Zero Partnership Team now embedded within Canterbury and Rochester dioceses - working across different teams
- Second round of energy audits have been commissioned for 10 more churches
- St Luke's Net Zero Demonstrator Church work well underway
- Energy Footprint Tool Completion Rate at 43% (was 38% last year) – closes 30th June but net zero team can still input!
- National funding available for net zero work in Churches being publicised: Quick Wins, Boiler Hardship Replacement

Next Steps

- Re-establish Net Zero Working Group to provide governance to the net zero work
- Understand implications for working towards the Eco Diocese Silver Award and develop plan accordingly
- Work with churches who have had energy audits to develop a net zero carbon action plan and apply for relevant funding
- Work with Eco Champions to organise an Eco Conference
- Support application for second demonstrator church
- Secure funding for subsidised energy audits

Concerns

- Delay in energy audit reports being written for first 10 churches - they have not yet been able to draw down the associated £3K grant and be supported with carbon net zero action plans for their churches
- Barriers for schools wishing to place solar panels on roofs and lack of government funding for decarbonisation work
- Significant fundraising will be necessary for parishes to deliver net zero projects.


Future
