

We seek to provide spiritual and sacred spaces within our sessions and offer. Opportunities to root ourselves, find space to breathe and an invitation to connect with God.


We offer a broad diet of training, that seeks to meet the diverse needs of each school. Our training and events are open to all, 'take and eat' as much as you need.

How to book on courses



Please complete the sign-up (booking form) in the name of the member of staff attending. This is to ensure they receive all the necessary information about the course, venue, time and zoom link if required.

If you have access to a school credit card, we encourage you to pay in this way. However, we can send the school an invoice for training if that is preferred. Booking and non-attendance






